

Dear Homeowners,

The following message was received from:

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We would like to host a workshop on Saturday, Sept. 30 on Survivable Space, best practices in pruning and limbing techniques, and forest management and thinning. The workshop will run from 9 AM - 1 PM and start at the Sheridan fire station for a classroom session, followed by a field visit. I have lined up 3 instructors for this workshop.

On Sept. 6, I visited several sites to scout for a potential field site and after careful consideration, one site in particular was ideal, providing a good combination for a field discussion about Survivable Space, pruning and tree thinning. We found that site in Mike and Dale Tozzi's at 119/123 Mira Sol. This does not mean that we cannot use the other sites we visited for other classes and workshops, but we will visit just this one site on Sept. 30.

The plan is to start at the Sheridan station for about 1.5 hours, and then move to the field site for a field class and discussion at the Tozzi's. We have created a flyer (attached) that I would very much appreciate your help in getting the word out to your HOA and neighbors.

Please **wear comfortable shoes and clothing to be both indoors and outdoors, sun protection, water and snacks**. We hope this workshop will provide useful information for your community as they start to prep for our November chipper day(s).
